Did Jesus have to die?

through atonement can we be reconciled with Him.

God created earth and man perfect. But when Adam and Eve disobeyed God's commands, He had to punish them. A judge who pardons law-breakers isn't a righteous judge. Likewise, overlooking sin would make the holy God unjust. What are the consequences of sin? "For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Romans 6:23 NIV). Ever since Adam's sin, every human has been guilty of disobeying God's righteous laws. "For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God" (Romans 3:23 NIV). Sin is not just big things like murder or blasphemy, but also includes love of money, hatred of enemies, and deceit of tongue and pride. Sin separates us from God and only

For you know that it was not with perishable things such as silver or gold that you were redeemed from the empty way of life handed down to you from your ancestors, but with the precious blood of Christ, a lamb without blemish or defect (1 Peter 1:18-19 NIV)

Since the children have flesh and blood, he too shared in their humanity so that by his death he might break the power of him who holds the power of death—that is, the devil— and free those who all their lives were held in slavery by their fear of death. For surely it is not angels he helps, but Abraham's descendants. For this reason he had to be made like them, fully human in every way, in order that he might become a merciful and faithful high priest in service to God, and that he might make atonement for the sins of the people. (Hebrews 2:14-17 NIV)

The verses above speak to the atoning sacrifice which is manifested in the death of Jesus. In the past under the Law these sacrifices of atonement were done through the High Priests. Hebrews 2:17 explains that Jesus is both the High Priest and the spotless Lamb. Atonement requires a perfect spotless sacrifice. So what this means is when we are "in Christ Jesus" we are covered by his blood through his sacrificial death, our sins are paid for, and we no longer have to die an eternal death. We receive eternal life though Jesus Christ. Importantly it is only through Jesus that atonement can be achieved. Only through Jesus Christ can our sins be forgiven, thus restoring our relationship with God and removing the separation caused by sin.

God made him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God. (2 Corinthians 5:12 NIV)

We can now be reconciled!

For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life. (John 3:16 NIV)

For if, while we were God's enemies, we were reconciled to him through the death of his Son, how much more, having been reconciled, shall we be saved through his life! (Romans 5:10 NIV)

So in my opinion the answer is yes! He had to die.

Like Nehemiah there are several young people who embody the spirit of rebuilding and they should be shown favour to carry out this mission. Thus future projections include training of youth members of all ages to serve in various capacities in the church and greater involvement in outreach ministries (visits to Juvenile Correctional facilities and Children's homes as well as homes for the aged) Also, it is the hope of the youth ministry to collaborate with other MAT teams to launch Singles and Couples Ministry during Family month 2016.

FPA Management Team

Our church community was truly blessed spiritually and materially during the first quarter of this year. An area in which this blessing was clearly evident was in the enabling activities of Finance, Property and Administration Management Team as summarized below.

The Church's income for the months of January and February this year was 40% higher than the same period last year. This increase is largely represented by a 6% increase in offerings and 52% increase in harvest ingathering. Close management of this improved inflow by the FPA Management Team enabled the Church to bring its inescapable external and internal obligations to a current state, fund requests from other Management Teams for budgeted projects and implement some planned maintenance at the manses and church compound. During the period the FPA also carried out staff appraisals, reorganized office personnel to cope with changing administrative demands and commenced the building of the chicken slater house at the Pringle Home.

We are truly thankful for the enabling improvement during the first quarter of this year and pray for continued guidance by the Holy Spirit as we all seek to deepen our Christian commitment and support the work of the Church.

Enhance the worship experience of those attending service, and develop and promote an inspiring, enriching and spiritually fulfilling worship experience for all services.


